



Odisha Budget 2026-27: Quick Summary

Fiscal Overview: The Odisha government presented a **₹3.10 lakh crore** budget for FY 2026-27. Total receipts (revenue + capital) are ₹2.97 lakh crore (Revenue: ₹2,48,500 cr; Capital: ₹48,500 cr) to match a total outlay of ₹3.10 lakh cr. Of this, revenue expenditure is pegged at ₹2,15,500 cr and capital expenditure at ₹94,500 cr. The budget targets a revenue surplus of ₹33,000 cr with a fiscal deficit of ₹38,800 cr. The government has set an ambitious 12% nominal GSDP growth, aiming to raise Odisha's GSDP to about ₹11.07 lakh crore. Capital outlay is ₹72,100 cr ($\approx 6.5\%$ of GSDP), reflecting a strong push on infrastructure.



Sectoral Allocations

- **Education:** ₹42,565 cr (schools, higher education, scholarships, new universities).
- **Agriculture & Allied:** ₹42,492 cr (PDS, MSP paddy procurement, CM-KISAN, crop diversification).
- **Health & Public Health Care:** ₹23,182 cr (health services, medical colleges, nutrition programmes).
- **Women & Child Welfare:** ₹16,152 cr (nutrition, girl child support, welfare schemes).
- **Disaster Management:** ₹13,472 cr (SDRMF/NDRMF funds).
- **Urban & Rural Development:** Urban ₹10,737 cr; Rural ₹10,204 cr (including MNREGA).
- **School & Mass Education:** ₹31,997 cr (free textbooks, uniforms, new model schools).
- **Energy:** ₹4,596 cr (power infrastructure, grid).
- **Tourism:** ₹1,022 cr (Tourism Land Bank, new attractions).
- **Infrastructure:** Major projects include two new expressways (NaMo Expressway and Atal Expressway) and heavy capital outlay ₹72,100 cr. This includes ₹1,000 cr for remote connectivity (roads/drinking water/electricity in villages).



Initiatives & Schemes

- **Mukhyamantri Kanya Sumangal Yojana:** New flagship for girls' education -: ₹20,000 savings bond at birth, and ₹1,00,001 on college graduation.
- **Subhadra Scheme:** Welfare for women -: ₹10,145 cr allocated (for eligible women's financial aid).
- **Dalkhai Yojana:** Aimed at eliminating bonded labor -: ₹220 cr.
- **VB-GRAM G Yojana:** Rural development and livelihoods -: ₹5,575 cr allocated.
- **Samruddha Anganwadi Yojana:** Early childhood care -: ₹635 cr.
- **Model Mandis:** Agricultural markets -: ₹100 cr.

- **World Green Grain Storage:** Food security -: ₹240 cr.
- **Smart City Mission (CM):** Urban development -: ₹100 cr.
- **Jagannath Affairs:** “Digital Hundi – SAMARPAN” online donation platform; ₹1,000 cr for a world-class Jagannath Interpretation Centre; ₹5 cr for temple ornaments inventory.
- **AI and Innovation:** ₹23 cr for a State AI Mission.
- **Tourism Land Bank:** ₹150 cr for tourism infrastructure development.
- **Migration & Livelihood:** Schemes like “Viksit Gaon Viksit Odisha” and MGNREGA completion fund increased to discourage distress migration.
- **Infrastructure Drives:** New coastal tourism project “Shamuka”; proposals for major expressways connecting south, west, and north Odisha.

Quick Facts

- **Budget Focus:** Welfare schemes (women, children, farmers), infrastructure (roads, water, electricity), and balanced growth.
- **Fiscal Rule:** Odisha targets 3% fiscal deficit to GSDP by 2026-27, but estimates show ~3.2% for 2026-27 with deficit ₹38,800 cr.
- **Debt:** State debt projected at ₹1.55 lakh cr by FY27 (≈22% of GSDP).
- **Continuity:** Most schemes (Subhadra, Anganwadi, village infrastructure) were launched in 2024-25 and expanded in this budget.
- **Welfare Compliance:** 6 lakh more pensioners added to Madhubabu Pension Yojana.
